

# BURNS' SUPPER DANCE PROGRAMME Saturday $2 \mathbf{7 t h}^{\text {th }}$ January 2024 

| 8 | 1s dance Fig 8 on own sides (pass 2s RSh to start), 1L ends facing out |
| :---: | :---: |
| 9-16 | Reels of 3 on sides ( $1 \mathrm{~s}+2 \mathrm{~s}$ pass RSh to start),1L end facing out |
| 17-24 | 1 L followed by 1 M dances behind 2 L , up between 2 s , behind 2 M , across set to $2^{\text {nd }}$ place own side (2s step up 23-24) |
| 25-32 | $1 \mathrm{~s}+3$ s dance RH across, $2 \mathrm{~s}+1$ s dance LH across, 1 L finishes facing out, ready to start again |

1-8 1 M followed by $2 \mathrm{M} \& 3 \mathrm{M}$ dance across the top of the set, down behind Ladies $\&$ -16 pass through Ladies to own side (to end in reverse order) \& all set
9-16 2 s dance RH across (2L with top couple \& 2 M with bottom couple), 2 s pass RSh \& dance LH across with other couple
17-24 1 L followed by $2 \mathrm{~L}+3 \mathrm{~L}$ dance across top of set $\&$ down behind Men to pick up their partners \& Promenade to original positions
25-32 1 s cast to $2^{\text {nd }}$ place \& turn 2 H , cast to $3^{\text {rd }}$ place \& turn 2 H

SHIFTIN' BOBBINS (R8x32)
Roy Clowes Ormskirk 6 (1983)
1-8 1s cross RH to double triangle position with $2 \mathrm{~s}+3 \mathrm{~s}$ \& set, 1 s cast up to top \& dance down to between 2s \& 3s
9-16 1 L dances $R H$ across with $2 M+3 M$ while $1 M$ dances $L H$ across with $2 L+3 L$, 1 s followed by $2 s+3 s$ dance down centre
17-24 $3 s$ followed by $2 s+1 \mathrm{~s}$ dance up ( $3 \mathrm{~s}+2 \mathrm{~s}$ cast off to places), 1 L dances LH across with $2 \mathrm{M}+3 \mathrm{M}$ while 1 M dances RH across with $2 \mathrm{~L}+3 \mathrm{~L}$
25-32 1 s dance up to top, cast down to $2^{\text {nd }}$ place opposite side $\&$ dance $1 / 2$ Fig of 8 around 2 s to end in $2^{\text {nd }}$ place on own sides

THE HAZEL TREE (J8x32)
John Drewry Brodie Book
1-8 $1 \mathrm{~s}+2 \mathrm{~s}$ dance Espagnole
9-16 1 s turn $1^{\text {st }}$ corners RH, pass RSh, turn $3^{\text {rd }}$ corner LH \& pass LSh to face $2^{\text {nd }}$ corner
17-24 1 s turn $2^{\text {nd }}$ corners RH, pass RSh, turn $4^{\text {th }}$ corner LH, 1s pass LSh to face down in middle (opposite sides) left hands joined
25-32 1 s lead down below 3 s , cross, cast up to $2^{\text {nd }}$ place own sides, $2 s+1 s+3$ s turn RH

1-8 $1 \mathrm{~s}+2 \mathrm{~s}$ set, 1 s cross RH \& cast 1 place, 1 s dance in to meet partner \& face down, 1 s turn 3 s with nearer hand to face up
9-16 1 s dance reflection reels of 3 on sides (1s dancing in $\&$ up between 2 s to start)
17-24 1s petronella turn to middle as $2 L+3 L$ \& $2 M+3 M$ change pl RH, set in lines across, 1s petronella turn to sides as $2 \mathrm{~s}+3 \mathrm{~s}$ cross $\mathrm{RH} \&$ set on sides
25-32 1 s dance Diag R\&L (1M crossing down \& 1L crossing up)

## PART 1

1-8 All dance $1 / 2$ Chain \& set to partners, $3 / 4$ turn RH to end with Ladies in centre for LH across
9-12 Ladies dance LH across $1 / 2$ way while Men dance $1 / 4$ way round clockwise, Ladies $1 / 2$ turn nearest Man RH
13-16 Men dance LH across $1 / 2$ way while Ladies dance $1 / 4$ way round clockwise \& all turn partners RH
17-24 All repeat bars 9-16 to original places
PART 2
25-32 1L \& 3M change places RH, cast behind 4s \& change places RH to join end of line while $1 \mathrm{M} \& 3 \mathrm{~L}$ dance similarly behind 2 s , all set
33-40 All Adv+Ret, $1 \mathrm{~s}+2 \mathrm{~L}+4 \mathrm{M}$ also $3 \mathrm{~s}+2 \mathrm{M}+4 \mathrm{~L}$ circle 4 H round to left to end in line across (1s \& 3s in centre of line)
41-48 All Adv+Ret, circle 8 H round $1 / 2$ way to end in Sq. Set opposite to original places
PART 3
49-72 Repeat PART 2 with 2 s \& 4s as dancing couples, all ending in original places
PART 4
73-96 Repeat PART 1

17-24 & 2 s \text { start while } 1 s+4 s+5 s \text { dance mirror reels of } 3 \text { on sides }(1 s \text { in/down to start })
\end{array}
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25-32 1 s set, cross down RH to $4^{\text {th }}$ place ( 4 s step up); 1 s set, cross down LH to $5^{\text {th }}$ place (5s step up) 23451
New top couple start every 16 bars. Repeat until 1 s back in $1^{\text {st }}$ place, they stand for 16 bars while 5 s continue bars 17-32 ending back in $5^{\text {th }}$ place

CURRIE MOUNTAIN (R8x32)

1-8 1 s cross RH \& cast 1 place, dance $1 / 2$ Fig of 8 round 2 s
9-16 1 s turn 3 s with nearer hands (1s dancing between 3 s ) \& turn 2 s with other hand
17-24 $1 \mathrm{~s}+3 \mathrm{~s}$ dance RH across \& LH across with 2 s
25-32 $2 s+1 s+3 s$ dance reels of 3 on sides (1s giving RSh to $3 s$ to start)

THE BELLE OF BON ACCORD (S4x32)
John Drewry Deeside II
1-8 $1 \mathrm{~L} \& 3 \mathrm{~L}$ cross down 1 place \& cast up on opposite side to centre as 1 M \& 3 M dance across \& cast down to centre, $1 \mathrm{~s}+2 \mathrm{~s} \& 3 \mathrm{~s}+4 \mathrm{~s}$ dance RH across
9-16 $1 \mathrm{~s} \& 3 \mathrm{~s}$ dance reel of 4 up \& down centre of dance
17-24 $1 \mathrm{~s} \& 3 \mathrm{~s} 3 / 4$ turn RH \& face up while $2 \mathrm{~s} \& 4 \mathrm{~s}$ dance up on sides $\&$ turn in to face down, all set \& circle 4 H round to left $\&$ end on sides
25-32 $1 \mathrm{~s} \& 3 \mathrm{~s}$ lead up, cross over, cast down 1 place $\&$ turn $2 \mathrm{H}, 1 \mathrm{~s}$ lead down to $4^{\text {th }}$ place while 3 s cast up on own sides to $2^{\text {nd }}$ place

1-8 1 s dance in, cast to $2^{\text {nd }}$ place \& RH across with 3 s
9-16 $2 s+1 s$ dance $L H$ across, 1 L followed by partner cast up round $2 \mathrm{~L} \&$ dance down middle to 1 L between $3 \mathrm{~s} \& 1 \mathrm{M}$ between 2 s
17-24 $\quad 1 \mathrm{~s}+2 \mathrm{~s}+3 \mathrm{~s}$ dance down the middle \& back
25-32 1 M followed by partner cast down round 2 L to $2^{\text {nd }}$ places on own side \& turn RH
33-40 $2 \mathrm{~s}+1 \mathrm{~s}+3 \mathrm{~s}$ circle 6 H round $\&$ back

"Auld Lang Syne" is a Scots poem written by Robert Burns in 1788 and set to the tune of a traditional folk song. It is well known in many countries, especially (but far from exclusively) in the English-speaking world; its traditional use 6eing to celebrate the start of the New Year at the stroke of midnight. By extension, it is also sung at funerals, graduations, and as a farewell or ending to other occasions and in many countries the Scout movement sing it to close jamborees and other functions.
The song's Scots title may be translated into English literally as 'old long since', or more idiomatically, 'long long ago', 'days gone by' or 'old times'. Consequently 'For auld lang syne', as it appears in the first line of the chorus, is loosely translated as 'for (the sake of) old times'.
