9-16 5L dances RH across with 2s while 5M dances LH across with 4s, 5s lead up thru 1s & cast back to centre

17-24 5L dances LH across with 2s **while** 5M dances RH across with 4s, 5s lead down thru 3s & cast back to centre

5s turn (Kilt Grip) twice, 5s+1s set & dance part LH across (5s dance ½ way while 1s dance ¼ way & into centre to face 2s)

A TRIP TO BAVARIA (R4x32)

James MacGregor-Brown Collins Pocket Ref

- 1- 4 1s & 4s cross RH while 2s+3s dance ½ RH across, 1s+3s & 2s+4s change places LH on sides
- 3s & 2s cross RH **while** 1s+4s dance ½ RH across, & repeat until back in original places
- 17-24 1s set to 2s, cross over to face 3s, set & cross to face 4s
- 25-32 1s set to 4s & cross over to 4th place on opposite sides, all Adv+Ret 2 steps 1s changing places RH to retire to own sides

THE SCALLYWAG (J8x40)

1-8 1s dance long cast (4 bars) as 2s step up, turn LH to face 1st corners

9-16 1s set to 1st corners, turn corner ³/₄ RH into lines across & face 4th corner, ¹/₂ LSh reel of 3 across into lines across

17-24 Advance&Retire, 1s dance RSh round each other to face 3rd corner positions

25-32 Repeat bars 9-16 with these corners, finishing 1M between 2s facing down to 1L between 3s

1s set advancing, join RH & set, 1L turning under arms, 1s face up RHJ on opposite sides, 1s cross up & cast to 2nd place own sides

THE GARRY STRATHSPEY (S4x32)

James B Cosh 22 SCDs+2

1-8 1s+2s & 3s+4s dance ½ R&L, 1s+4s (in centre) dance ½ R&L

2s+4s & 1s+3s circle 4H left ½ way, 2s+3s circle 4H right ½ way, 1s dance up to top & all face as for Reel of 4 on sides

17-24 All set HS & dance ½ Grand Chain

25-32 All dance Reel of 4 on sides. 2 3 4 1

THE HIGHLAND RAMBLER (R8x40)

1- 8 9-16	1s dance in, cast to 2 nd place & RH across with 3s 2s+1s dance LH across, 1L followed by partner cast up round 2L & dance down middle to 1L between 3s & 1M between 2s
17-24 25-32 33-40	1s+2s+3s dance down the middle & back 1M followed by partner cast down round 2L to 2 nd places on own side & turn RH 2s+1s+3s circle 6H round & back



"Auld Lang Syne" is a Scots poem written by Robert Burns in 1788 and set to the tune of a traditional folk song. It is well known in many countries, especially (but far from exclusively) in the English-speaking world; its traditional use being to celebrate the start of the New Year at the stroke of midnight. By extension, it is also sung at funerals, graduations, and as a farewell or ending to other occasions and in many countries the Scout movement sing it to close jamborees and other functions.

The song's Scots title may be translated into English literally as 'old long since', or more idiomatically, 'long long ago', 'days gone by' or 'old times'. Consequently 'For auld lang syne', as it appears in the first line of the chorus, is loosely translated as 'for (the sake of) old times'.
